Thanksgiving is still a very popular holiday on the calendar. A high majority of people still celebrate it. It is still the busiest travel holiday in the world. It still brings folks together, even if they don't really know why. Ungratefulness has become easier as time passes, but its been around for a long time. It seems some people just don't appreciate a good deed when it comes their way.

Jesus encountered a group of ten men all inflicted with a debilitating disease that had removed them from living a normal life. The story is found in Luke 17. Leprosy was an incurable disease that would force the one suffering to be removed from social contact with anyone, including family, because it so easily spread from one person to another. When Jesus walked by, they cried out in unison for Him to have mercy on them. They both knew who He was and what He was capable of. Although there are instances in the gospels where Jesus would actually touch a leper to heal them, in this scene, He choses only to direct the ten to, "Go and show yourselves to the Priests." Apparently Jesus had acquired some level of authority and trust among the people, because there is every indication that the ten did as they were told without question or hesitation. And along the way, all ten were healed! Ten lives changed. Ten families reunited. Ten celebrations! But Luke points out something rather peculiar. Only one returned to Jesus to give thanks. With one important detail: the one who went back was a Samaritan! (The Jews were always quick to point out how dreadful, despised, and ungrateful the Samaritans were!) Yet this one was the only one to offer thanks. If fact, it says, "With a loud voice gave glory to God, fell down at the feet of Jesus, thanking Him." The other nine went their way with not so much as a glance back at the one who had set them free from their affliction.

We are called to be the one, in the group of ten, to be thankful. In a society that has maybe forgotten what it means to give thanks, we have to say it. Not assume that everyone knows it, not say we'll get to it later, not neglect it because its not trendy. In a busy world, those two words can have a huge impact. Say it to others like we're saying it to Jesus, because it might just be the only time that person will hear it. We should not take His blessings for granted. A grateful heart that returns to God is a key part of faith.
